1 **BYLAWS** 2 First Christian Church of Greensboro, Inc. 3 4 We, the members of First Christian Church of Greensboro, Inc., a congregationally governed body, in order 5 to know and love God, nurture each other and reach out and welcome all people in the name of Jesus 6 Christ, do hereby adopt these Bylaws on July 1, 2018. Upon this date, any previous written or implied 7 Constitution and Bylaws are hereby nullified. 8 9 I. The Church and Fiscal Year 10 A. The Church and Fiscal year shall begin on January, 1. 11 II. 12 Congregation 13 A. Membership 14 1. Membership in this congregation shall consist of those who are members of the 15 congregation upon adoption of this document, those who unite with it by confession 16 of faith in Jesus Christ and subsequent baptism by immersion, those who unite by 17 transfer of membership, and those who elect to unite with this church as an associate 18 member while retaining their membership in their home church. 19 2. Elected officers and Board members must be members of First Christian Church of 20 Greensboro. Associate members may not vote on church business or hold elective 21 office. 22 23 B. Responsibilities 24 1. The congregation shall faithfully define and carry out its mission, vision and goals. 25 2. The congregation shall own, control and may encumber its property. 26 3. The congregation shall establish its budgets and financial policies. 27 4. The congregation shall call its minister(s) and sustain its minister(s) in faithfulness and 28 honor. 29 5. The congregation shall participate, through voting representatives, in Regional and General assemblies of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). 30 31 6. The congregation shall follow the Ethical Guidelines for Congregational Conduct, 32 Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). 33 C. Meetings 34 35 1. A congregational meeting may be called by the Board Chair or by vote of the Board. 36 2. A congregational meeting shall be called upon request of 10% of participating membership as defined in the most recent Yearbook and Directory of Christian 37 38 Church (Disciples of Christ) or 26 members (whichever is less) when presented to the 39 Board Chair. 40 3. Notice of a congregational meeting and its stated purpose shall be given two weeks 41 prior to such meeting. 42 4. Congregational meetings shall be conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order 43 Newly Revised. 44 45 III. Officers A. Election 46

47 1. The following officers shall be elected by the congregation by a majority vote of 48 members present at an annual congregational meeting held for this purpose: Board Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer. 49 2. These officers shall also serve as officers of First Christian Church of Greensboro, Inc. 50 51 3. A slate of officers shall be presented by the Personnel Team and nominations shall be 52 taken from the floor. 53 54 B. Term of Office 55 The Board Chair shall be elected to a term of one year. The Board Chair may be elected 56 to a consecutive one year term, after which one year must elapse before being eligible 57 for re-election. 2. The Vice Chair shall be elected to a term of one year. The Vice Chair may be elected to a 58 59 consecutive one year term, after which one year must elapse before being eligible for re-60 election. 61 3. The Secretary shall be elected to a term of one year. The Secretary may be elected to a 62 second and a third consecutive one year term, after which one year must elapse before 63 being eligible for re-election. 64 4. The Treasurer(s) shall be elected to a term of one year and may be re-elected for up to 65 two additional consecutive one year terms. 66 IV. 67 **Board** 68 Membership The Board shall consist of: 69 70 **Board Chair** 71 Vice Chair 72 Secretary 73 Treasurer(s) 74 Chair of the Elders 75 Chair of the Trustees 76 Chair of the Connection Team 77 Chair of the Outreach Team 78 Chair of the Worship Team 79 Chair of the Faith Formation Team 80 Chair of the Property Team 81 Chair of the Stewardship and Finance Team 82 Chair of the Personnel Team 83 B. Election and Terms of Office for Board Members Other than Officers 84 1. Chairs of the teams listed above shall be elected by the congregation by a majority 85 86 vote of members present at an annual congregational meeting held for this 87 purpose. 88 2. Board members, other than Officers, shall be elected for one year and may be re-89 elected for up to two (2) additional consecutive one year terms. 90 91 C. Meetings 1. The Board shall determine and publicize meeting dates. 92

2. The Board shall meet no less than eight (8) times per year.

94			3. Board meetings are open and members of the congregation have the right to
95			attend these meetings and express opinions.
96			4. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Board Chair or upon request of
97			at least 50% of the Board.
98			5. In order to conduct the business of the church, at least two thirds (2/3) of the voting
99			members must be present at a meeting.
100			6. Board meetings shall follow an agenda and be governed by <i>Robert's Rule of Order</i>
101			Newly Revised.
102			7. The agenda shall be made available to the congregation prior to the Board meeting.

104		D.	Authority
105			1. The Board shall perform its duties according to the authority granted in the Articles
106			of Incorporation or otherwise delegated by the congregation.
107			2. In keeping with the traditions of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), the
108			ultimate authority for all actions shall rest with the congregation.

110		E.	Responsibilities
111			1. The Board shall serve as the Board of Directors of the corporation.
112			2. The Board shall conduct its affairs in harmony with these Bylaws. Regular reports
113			of Board activity shall be made to the congregation.
114			3. The Board shall be responsible for conducting the business of the congregation. It
115			shall oversee the planning, coordination, research, evaluation, and implementation
116			of congregational activities.
117			4. The Board shall approve, when necessary, the creation of a Search Committee for
118			the purpose of securing a minister for the congregation.
119			5. The Board shall review, in coordination with the Trustees, these Bylaws every three
120			(3) years and present proposed amendments to the congregation.

122	V.		ers, Trustees, Financial Secretaries and Deacons
123		A.	
124			1. Elders, one Trustee, one Financial Secretary, and Deacons shall be elected by the
125			congregation by a majority vote of members present at an annual congregational
126			meeting held for this purpose.
127			2. There shall be a total of twelve (12) Elders. Elders are elected for a term of one year
128			with option to extend term to total of three (3) consecutive years, not to succeed
129			themselves for a period of one year. The Elders shall elect a Chair, from the serving
130			Elders, who will serve on the Board.
131			3. Trustees are elected for terms of three (3) years, not to succeed themselves for a
132			period of one year, for a total of three (3) Trustees. The Trustees shall elect a Chair,
133			from the serving Trustees, who will serve on the Board.
134			4. Financial Secretaries are elected for terms of two (2) years, not to succeed
135			themselves for a period of one year, for a total of three (3) Financial Secretaries.
136			5. There shall be at total of 24 Deacons elected for terms of one year and may be
137			elected for two (2) additional consecutive one year terms.

139	VI.	Lea	adership Teams
140		A.	Team Functions

141 1. The Connections Team oversees and coordinates the nurture and wellbeing of the 142 congregation, individually and collectively, to promote a sense of wholeness and 143 inclusion of the entire church membership. 2. The Outreach Team oversees and coordinates the financial and human interaction 144 145 of First Christian Church and its' members with the needs of the broader community outside the doors of the church. 146 147 3. The Worship Team oversees and coordinates, with the ministerial staff, all the 148 components which provide a meaningful worship experience through regularly 149 scheduled and special services, and the music program. 150 4. The Faith Formation Team oversees and coordinates all education and faith formative activities of the congregation, providing opportunities and resources for 151 personal faith growth, as well as engagement with issues of the larger community. 152 153 5. The Property Team oversees and coordinates the care of all real property and capital equipment, supervises all services for property and grounds, and cooperates 154 with the Trustees to study needs and recommend improvements. 155 156 6. The Stewardship and Finance Team oversees and coordinates, with the Senior 157 Minister, Treasurer(s), and Financial Secretaries, the financial activities of the church. This will include, at minimum, promoting an ongoing program of 158 159 stewardship and financial awareness, preparation of an annual budget and 160 solicitation of pledges, and providing for a systematic method of annual review. 161 7. The Personnel Team oversees and coordinates the hiring and administration of all 162 staff of First Christian Church, as well as the selection and recruitment of volunteers to provide a full slate of leaders for annual approval by the congregation. 163 164 VII. 165 Ministerial Staff 166 A. Positions 167 1. The congregation shall be served by a Senior Minister. If the Senior Minister 168 position is vacated, an Interim Senior Minister shall be called. 169 2. In addition to the Senior Minister, the congregation may be served by other ministerial staff. If another ministerial position is vacated, an Interim Minister may 170 171 be called. 172 173 B. Ministerial Responsibilities 174 1. The Senior Minister shall be the spiritual leader of the congregation. 175 2. The Senior Minister, in cooperation with the Board, shall be the chief administrator 176 for the congregation. 177 3. The Senior Minister shall assure that the life and work of the congregation complies 178 with the congregation's Bylaws, policies and procedures. 179 4. The Senior Minister shall be an ex-officio, non-voting member of all teams and 180 groups of the congregation. 181 5. The Senior Minister shall supervise and evaluate the work of the church staff. 182 6. The responsibilities of ministerial positions shall be adapted to meet current 183 congregational needs.

185		C.	Selection
186			1. The Board Chair shall select a Search Committee to be approved by the Board.
187			2. The Search Committee shall present its recommendation to the congregation at a
188			congregational meeting.
189			3. If at least three fourths of those voting at this congregational meeting approve the
190			recommendation, the Chair of the Search Committee shall extend a call to the
191			prospective minister on behalf of the congregation.
192			
193		D.	Terms of Employment
194			1. Compensation, terms of employment, and termination procedures shall be
195			stipulated in a letter of call/employment agreement.
196			2. Copies of this letter of call/employment agreement are to be kept by the Personnel
197			Team Chair, the Treasurer and the Minister.

199	VIII.	Αn	nendments to Bylaws
200		1.	A proposed amendment to these Bylaws must be presented to the Board Chair in
201			written form and must be accompanied by the written support of at least fifteen (15)
202			congregational members or all serving Trustees.
203		2.	The Board Chair shall assure that a proposed amendment is provided to the members of
204			the Board at least two (2) weeks prior to the Board meeting at which the amendment
205			will be considered.
206		3.	The Board shall present a proposed amendment to the congregation. The Board will
207			also present is recommendation, non-recommendation or no comment.
208		4.	A copy of the proposed amendment and the Board's opinion must be made available to
209			the members of the congregation at least two (2) weeks prior to a vote being taken at a
210			congregational meeting.
211		5.	A proposed amendment shall be approved by a two thirds (2/3) majority of the
212			members of the congregation voting on the proposed amendment.
213		6.	An approved amendment is recorded by the Secretary and forwarded to the Trustees,
214			who shall ensure the amendment is incorporated into these Bylaws.
